To seek to ensure the S.K.G.B.'s prosperity by collectively directing its affairs, whilst meeting the appropriate interests of its relevant stakeholders (members)

Who can be a Director?

It is generally up to the members to appoint, as directors, people they believe will run the company well on their behalf.

The qualities that are looked for in a Director:

- 1. Act in good faith
- 2. Act in honestly
- 3. Act in best interests of the S.K.G.B.
- 4. Take decisions without ulterior motives.
- 5. Not to use S.K.G.B. property or information for personal gain.
- 6. Take expert advice.
- 7. Act within the S.K.G.B.'s objectives.
- 8. Act within the directors powers.
- 9. Declare any conflicting interests.
- 10. Exercise reasonable skill and care.
- 11. Have regard to creditors.
- 12. Do not mislead stakeholders (members)

Who can't be a Director?

- Anybody who is currently disqualifed by a court from acting as a company director (unless he
 or she has leave of the court to undertake certain functions for the company in question)
- An undercharged bankrupt.(except with leave of the court)
- In Scotland anybody under the age of 16.
